## 4. Contract

The solicitation and all attachments are incorporated by reference as a part of this bid or proposal.

If the bidder/offeror is a partnership or corporation, the Contracting Officer may request such bidder/offeror to furnish evidence of the authority of the party executing the bid or proposal.

When a partnership bids, the signature of one partner is sufficient.

This contract may be terminated by the U.S. Postal Service upon notice of not less than 24 hours, or by the contractor upon notice of not less than 15 days; and without the allowance of any indemnity or extra pay in lieu of indemnity to the contractor.

## Equal Opportunity Affirmative Action Program

c. The bidder/offeror further agrees that (*unless it has obtained identical certifications from proposed subcontractors for specific time periods*) it will obtain identical certifications from proposed subcontractors before awarding subcontracts exceeding \$10,000 that are not exempt from the provisions of the Equal Opportunity clause, that it will retain these certifications in its files; and that it will forward the following notice to these proposed subcontractors (*except when they have submitted identical certifications for specific time period(s)*):

## Notice

A certification of no segregated facilities must be submitted before the award of a subcontract exceeding \$10,000 that is not exempt from the Equal Opportunity clause. The certification may be submitted whether for each subcontract or for all subcontracts during a period (*quarterly, semiannually, or annually*).

## Parent Company and Taxpayer Identification Number
